PLOT

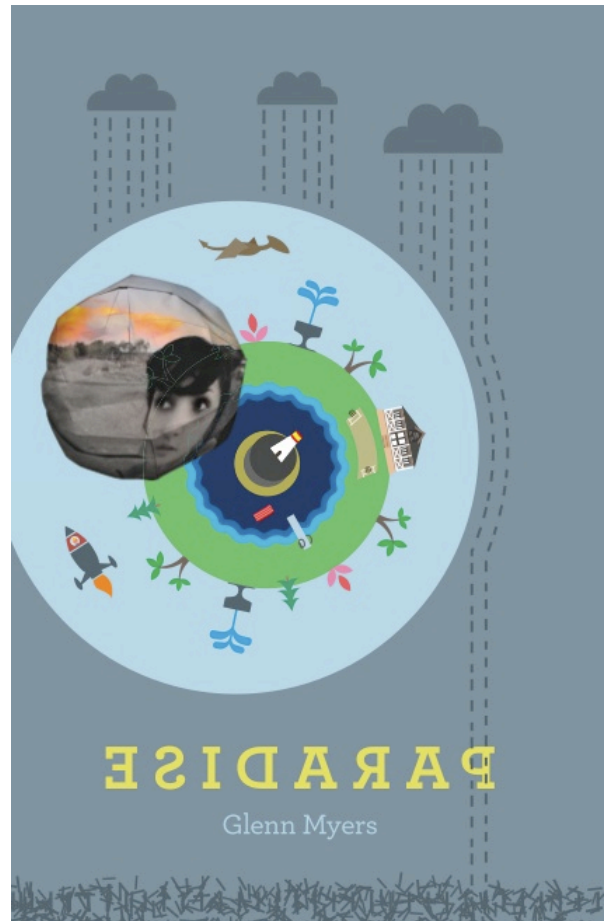
At heart of the comedy is how we both long for, and flee from, honesty and intimacy.
